Sometimes, when we look at different generations, we may think to ourselves, "Boy, I just don't understand this generation." While there may be a lot that separates us from each other, there is something that we all have in common. No matter if we are 18 or 80. No matter if we are 5 or 55. We all have this one thing in common: we all crave human connection. From the depths of our souls, we want to know that someone is there and cares.

Some may say, "I just don't understand people today. Looking down and always on their phones." However, I would say that those phones are just tools for finding human connection. Many times, when we are on our phones, we are text messaging our friends and family or looking to see what they are doing on social media. Depending on what is happening, we are reacting somehow or commenting on their posts. It is estimated that there are over 7 billion people that have cell phones today, which is an unbelievable number. Our world today uses those small devices as a way of finding and fostering human connection.

Another way that we find human connection is through greeting cards. There is something exciting and special about trucking it out to the mailbox and finding a card from a friend or family member. That simple act of receiving a card lets you know that someone cares. Whether you are celebrating a birthday, getting over a cold, or mourning the loss of a loved one, that humble piece of paper folded in half with some writing on it means so much, more than what it may appear. In the end, it does not matter if we are using Instagram or old-fashioned telegrams, both are ways in which we find human connection.

Our gospel reading touches on this key desire for human connection. Deep down, one of our greatest fears is feeling alone, unloved, and forgotten. Luke 15:1-10 speaks to that fear and gives us hope. Through these parables, we find out how much God cares for us. We are not just a nameless and faceless vast creation of 8 billion people that God looks down at. Instead, we see that God cares for us as individuals, who have a name, face, and our own unique story.



St. Johns United Church of Christ Council Meeting Minutes September 9, 2025 – 7:30 p.m.

Opening Prayer: Dave Gingrich opened the meeting and Reverend Cassandra Granados gave the opening prayer. There were 10 members present.

Minutes of Last Meeting: Approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report: Reported by Holly Gonter

Month of August 2025

General fund income for the month of \$26,142 is \$2,034 better than budget.

Expenses for the month of \$28,976 were under the budget by \$7,314.

Resulting shortfall for the month of \$2,834 is \$9,348 better than the budget.

August 2025 YTD

General fund income year-to-date of \$164,221 is \$30,943 less than the budget.

Compared to last year, through the same month (center column) **income is lower by \$33,822.** Expenses year-to-date of \$254,165 were less than budget by \$18,093.

Note: Budget includes \$9,000 per month for an Associate Minister beginning with July

Resulting shortfall year-to-date of \$89,945 is \$12,851 worse than the budget.

Cash

Beginning cash balance for the year was \$25,146 and ending cash is \$9,957.

We have transferred \$77,646 from investments to cover general fund expenses.
