St. John's UCC Church Council Meeting November 11, 2025 at 7:30 pm

Opening Prayer: Dave Gingrich opened the meeting and Reverend Cassandra Granados gave the opening prayer. There were 13 members present.

Minutes of Last Meeting: One typo was noted, approved as corrected.

Treasurer's Report:

Month of November 2025

General fund income for the month of \$16,335 is \$12,773 less than budget.

Expenses for the month of \$24,235 were under the budget by \$9,857.

Resulting shortfall for the month of \$7,900 is \$2,916 worse the budget.

November 2025 YTD

General fund income year-to-date of \$220,477 is **\$51,011 less than the budget.**

Compared to last year through the same month (center column) **income is lower by \$40,277.**

Expenses year-to-date of \$334,807 were less than budget by \$45,277.

Resulting shortfall year-to-date of \$114,331 is \$6,005 worse than the budget.

Cash

Beginning cash balance for the year was \$25,146 and ending cash is \$16,054.

We have transferred \$97,855 from investments to cover general fund expenses.

Cassandra was on vacation from November 17th-23rd to celebrate her wedding anniversary and Jatin's birthday. Cassandra taught the St. John's Pre-school (4- and 5-year-olds) on November 25th. The children learned about "giving thanks" and "counting our blessings". Cassandra will teach again on December 17th.

Upcoming Events:

Christmas Candlelight services will be on December 24th at 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. In lieu of a sermon during the Christmas Eve services, we will be offering an original play called, "The Perfect Present!", which offers a modern reading of Luke 2:8-20. The play is written in the couplet rhyme scheme of "Twas the Night Before Christmas".

Director of CE Report

Natalie Peterman reported:

December has been a busy and meaningful month in Christian Education. We hosted our Advent Festival and an all-church luncheon with over 50 people in attendance. During the festival, the youth painted the windows in the cloister and rehearsed for the Christmas pageant. Our Family Sunday service featured the Youth Christmas Pageant, which included 13 of our church youth.

We are preparing for our two-night Live Nativity on December 20th and 21st. Our youth have also taken on the Advent lantern lighting each week and have been meeting with older members of the congregation for conversation and the symbolic lighting of the candle. Seniors, confirmants, and younger youth have all stepped in to help where needed.

Looking ahead, we already have a busy start to 2026, including:

- Confirmation beginning in January
- Homeless awareness weekend – February 14th - 15th
- Planning a youth retreat
- A special Youth Sunday honoring our seniors
- Assisting with Tuff bags – April 11th
- Summer community outreach projects

We are grateful for the continued support of the congregation as we grow our youth and family ministries.

Reports of the Boards

Elders/Sue Ferbrache reported:

- Discussed January 4th celebration of Marge Burkhart's 70 years as our awesome organist. A reception will be held after church.
- Discussed a facilitator or two will be needed for short term Bible Studies from prepared curriculum; will request volunteers.
- Advent offering proceeds to be split between our Blessing Box and Good Bread from Good People, a Ukraine organization that offering individuals with intellectual disabilities a chance for a full life and true integration into society.

Trustees

Rob Gump reported:

- Getting quotes for heating repair in the social hall kitchen
- Downspout outside of the lounge / youth room section of the building has been replaced to eliminate leakage in the walls
- Repairs are being completed to the rain gutter at Fourth & Faith to eliminate water draining onto the sidewalk and forming ice
- Looking at an upgrade to the remote door locks for the Cloister and CE Building. The current camera / door release system is outdated and not working well. This is a security issue for the office staff to know who is requesting entry into the buildings.

- Ushers and communion servers are filled for December
- The January 4th usher and communion server training that was to be held after worship is being rescheduled

Busy month! Advent Festival – painted windows; youth helped with youth Sunday script and helped plan for next year.

Constitution Review Committee:

- Dave Gingrich and Sue Ferbrache presented recommended updates to the St. John's Constitution & Bylaws.
- The primary changes are to reduce the number of Trustees, Elders and Board of Christian Education Council positions, modify the term limits and combine some sections that were duplicated throughout the document.
- M/S/C by Sue Ferbrache and Holly Gonter with one abstention.
- A summary of the proposed changes will be distributed to the congregation with the notice of the Annual Congregational Meeting to be held on Sunday, January 18. Copies of the proposed revised Constitution & Bylaws will be available in the church office.



Looking Back with Gratitude, Stepping Forward with Faith

As we begin a new year together, I find myself reflecting on all that God has been doing through Christian Education at St. John's. This past year was FULL! It was full of events, conversations, service and shared moments, but more importantly, it was full of connection. We spent time raising awareness around homelessness, inviting our youth and families to look beyond themselves and notice the needs of others. Our youth group gathered regularly, not just for activities but for relationship building, laughter and faith conversations. We supported the Blessing Box, a quiet but powerful ministry that continues to offer care to our community day after day. We shared a meaningful Friendsgiving, where food and fellowship reminded us how important it is simply to sit at the table together. During Advent, our youth pageant and lantern visits brought generations together in worship. We truly had a year filled with growth, service and relationships that continue to shape our faith.

All of these moments matter. They take planning, coordination and energy. But what matters most is not the event itself, it's what we take with us afterward. The compassion that grows. The confidence our youth gain. The reminder that faith is something we live, not just something we talk about on Sunday mornings.

As January often brings talk of resolutions and fresh starts, I find myself thinking less about doing something brand new and more about taking the next faithful step. We don't need to reinvent ourselves or set impossible expectations. Instead, we are invited to trust God with where we are and listen for where God is gently leading us next. That may look like showing up more fully. It may look like serving in a new way or simply deepening an existing relationship. It may look like pausing, listening and trusting that God is already at work, even when the path ahead isn't completely clear.

As we move into this new year, my hope is that Christian Education at St. John's continues to be a place where faith is nurtured, questions are welcomed and all generations feel connected. I am deeply thankful for the youth, families, volunteers and church leaders who make this ministry possible and for the many blessings we have shared along the way.

May we step into this year with open hearts, trusting God not to make us brand new, but to walk with us as we take the next step together.
