THE CARILLON Faith Should Affect Your Life

Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you.

It is not only we modern-day people who desire a place and time when and where people would speak civilly to one another. Ancient Christians worked on that, too. The author of Ephesians was certain that faith in Christ is not only world-changing, but also person-changing. You do not receive God's grace without being changed. A proclamation that has long been preached is that people should see something change when you become a Christian. Your faith should affect your life.

So, when the time of Lent creeps into our minds, Christians will often think about change, sacrifice, doing something that will be a different action for those 40+ days; some act of omission that will create an awareness of the many things that can divert our attention and sometimes our lives off the path God imagines. Sometimes the idea of giving up something like chocolate is mocked as trivial. Sometimes it is. But it can also be a real struggle and a reminder of one's desire to be a person who has been changed and is passionate about wanting to continue changing for the better.

Protestantism has a history of reacting against rules and traditions that have become arbitrary and unnecessary (See the word "protest" in our roots). The Lenten menu is a rule that was once a point of much tension in the church. Becoming vegetarian was once the rule of faith during Lent. That has been reduced to the rule of Friday meatlessness – which has also given rise to the blessing of Friday fish fry's and potato perogies.

One act of eating-defiance in 1522 is, by some, considered a key to protestant reformation. It was then that followers of Ulrich Zwingli publicly rejected the Catholic prohibition against eating meat during Lent and held a public gathering as Easter drew closer. Gathered around a table, they joined together for a meal in which they ate **sausages!** Of course, they were arrested.

This Little Light of God's

"No one after lighting a lamp hides it under a jar, or puts it under a bed, but puts it on a lampstand, so that those who enter may see the light." – Luke 8:16 (NRSV)

Every sermon I have ever heard, or preached, about letting your light shine was embedded with a set of instructions, calling the listener to figure out their gifts, put them to good use in the world, and shine as bright as they can.

There is nothing wrong with that message once in a while, but a lifetime of my favorite biblical metaphor telling me to "Go! Do! Shine!" makes me feel like I'm a 40-watt bulb shining in a 100-watt world.

I worry that I won't live up to the gifts I've been given or that trying to have the brightest light will make me burn out. Will I still be loved if I push the dimmer switch on my lamp once in a while and unplug from the world?

The part all those well-meaning calls to action miss is that it's not my light or your light. It is God's light. What a relief for all those times when my bulb threatens to come loose from its socket. How easy to forget that God is our source of energy. I know God is strong enough that even if my bulb is a little dull, or in need of changing, God's light will find a way to shine.

Hey God, remember that time your light found its way through a tiny baby in Bethlehem? May it find its way through me, too. Amen.



THE CARILLON

Love is patient, love is kind, it is not envious. Love does not brag, it is not puffed up. It is not rude, it is not self-serving, it is not easily angered or resentful. It is not glad about injustice, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.” 1 Corinthians 13:4-7

On Christmas Eve Eve, I ran out to pick up just one more thing that I needed. And there it was in my line of vision the minute I walked into the store...Valentine Day cards and candy and craft packs and lots of red and pink! It wasn't even Christmas!! But it happens more and more. I would imagine along with St. Patrick's Day green will come the next wave of summer clothes. And so our new normal is progressing.

So I googled Valentine's Day in the church. I found a crazy silly video by two men called The Skit Guys. (I actually saw them in person a number of years ago at a conference I was at in Chicago.) The video was great and typical of their skits; along with the funny comes a message. I would like to share it with you.

“There are a lot of expectations for Valentine’s Day. Someone, probably a Hallmark employee, decided that February 14th would be the day to declare and demonstrate your love to that special someone. Cards, flowers and chocolates caught on quickly and became a near requirement even for preschool children. But what gets lost in finding the perfect card or gift is the very essence of what love is and how we can best share with those around us.

1 Corinthians 13 is the famous biblical love chapter in Christian circles and beyond. It’s beautiful because it describes the kind of perfect love that God has for us, and through God we are able to love our spouses, children, extended family, co-workers and neighbors this same way. It’s an active love; a love that is more committed to that person than our own feelings at the time. Gift giving isn’t even mentioned because this love, God’s perfect love, is worth so much than anything money could ever buy.

Sometimes a gift is a hit and sometimes it’s a miss. In any case, as either the giver or recipient, let’s not fool ourselves into thinking the gift is the sum of how much we love or are loved. We can enjoy Valentine’s Day as a good excuse to spoil the ones we love and share God’s love in a special way with those who are lonely and hurting. But let’s stay focused: no material thing or sentimental card can ever replace the simple gestures of God’s love expressed every day.

Ask God to show you practical ways you demonstrate God’s perfect love to others on a daily basis.”



St. John's UCC Church Council Meeting January 10th, 2023 at 7:30pm

The meeting of St. John's United Church of Christ Church Council was called to order on January 10th, 2023 at 7:30 pm by President Dan Dummermuth. There were 12 members in attendance including Pastor Dotty Hartzell and Rev. Jeff Jackson.

Rev. Jeff lit the Christ candle and offered an opening prayer.

The November 2022 minutes were approved as submitted.

Treasurer Adam Herman gave the treasurer's report. General Fund Income for December 2022 was \$43,136 and Expenses were \$23,782 resulting in a gain of \$19,353 for the month. General Fund Income year-to-date is \$294,107 with Expenses year-to-date of \$356,881 resulting in a year-to-date shortfall of \$62,774. To date \$95,544 has been transferred from investments to cover expenses. M/S/C by Rob Gump and Sue Ferbrache to approve the treasurer's report. Adam reported \$2,650 was collected for a staff love gift. Each staff member received \$265 with Rev. Jackson abstaining from distribution. \$378 was collected from the Advent Offering with proceeds going to the Puentes (Bridges) Program. An Investment Committee report will be given to council at the February meeting.

SENIOR MINISTER REPORT- Rev. Jeff. reported on the following: 1) Formation and Development of the Tuscarawas Valley Association of Welcoming and Accepting Churches. 2) Confirmation-The class participated in the Advent Lantern Intergenerational Project. Confirmation Sunday will be held on May 21st. 3) AV issues at Fourth & Faith have been resolved. 4) The CWS clean-up buckets were delivered to Templed Hills. 5) Christmas and New Year's church services were well attended. There were 200 who attended the Christmas Eve services. 6) Rev. Jeff will be meeting with Starlight Enterprises (John R. Herzig) for a possible Art Exhibit and Show at Fourth & Faith. 7) Study based on the book, *Inspired: Slaying Giants, Walking on Water and Loving the Bible Again*. 8) Interim Phase II. President Dan has created a pro tem committee consisting of the 2022-2023 Elders and Council Executive Committee to consider possible projects to undertake during the Interim.

PASTOR OF VISITATION REPORT- Pastor Dotty updated council that 276 items including scarves, gloves and hats were distributed by the front lawn clothesline. The sock-o-Claus project was successful. Eighty Emergency Room Kids Kits were distributed to Cleveland Clinic Union Hospital and Trinity Twin Cities Hospital. This will be an ongoing project. The Advent Lantern Project with our confirmands (families) and older members of the church was a very special part of our Advent season church services. Pastor Dotty has officiated five funerals, this past month. M/S/C by Sue Ferbrache and Dotty Hartzell for the building of a new and larger Blessing Box. A person has generously volunteered to build it and will work with Belinda Lentz on the design.

Council Minutes

DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION-Pastor Dotty reported for Belinda. The Youth Group will be having a "drop-in" meeting, Sunday evening once a month from 6-7:30pm. The Homeless Awareness Project will be January 28-29th. Items and donations can be dropped off at the church the evening of the 28th. Canned goods (no vegetables), personal hygiene products, paper products, cleaning supplies, and money will be accepted. XOO kids have been meeting regularly and they love making crafts. Many cards and Christmas ornaments were distributed to our members who are home bound and in nursing homes. Belinda is on her annual trip to Arizona to attend Border Issues Fair. Prayers for a safe experience for this worthwhile endeavor.

BOARD REPORTS

ELDERS REPORT- Sue Ferbrache reported on the upcoming Lenten season. Ash Wednesday will be February 22nd, at Fourth & Faith. The meals were discussed. Michele Specht will prepare the main entrée for the Maundy Thursday meal on April 6th. She will work with a committee on sides, desserts, and service. The offering beneficiary was discussed. February communion dates and responsibilities are set. Scout Sunday is February 12th. M/S/C (one abstention) by Sue Ferbrache and Adam Herman to hire Daniel Grimminger as the new Pastor of Liturgy (Chancel Choir Director).

DEACONS REPORT- Sally McCombs reported the ushers for February are confirmed.

TRUSTEES REPORT –Rob Gump reported the heating and hot water tank issues are resolved. Roof repairs have been made where water was leaking into the ceilings and walls. There will most likely be future repairs and/or roof replacement projects. Rob discussed the advantages of signing a maintenance agreement with Simpson Salute Heating and Air. This will insure upkeep, repair and serviceability of our heating and cooling systems.

COMMITTEE/TASK FORCE REPORTS

Pastor Search Committee- In the past month, the Search Committee received two additional profiles. They conducted a first interview Zoom meeting with a candidate and later learned that they had taken an offer from another church. After many attempts to contact a second candidate for an interview, there was no response. The committee will move forward with patience and confidence that God will send the perfect person to fill our Senior Pastor position.

CONGREGATIONAL SOLICITATIONS- None.

OLD BUSINESS

Nominating Committee- The committee met and presented council with the 2023 ballot for the upcoming Congregational Meeting, in January. M/S/C by Dan Dummermuth and Rob Gump to accept the proposed ballot. There are several unfilled positions from 2022 and those will be filled with additional candidates who have agreed to be on council but are not on the ballot. M/S/C by Adam Herman and Holly Gonter that Dave Gingrich will fill the one-year term left for Vice President of council.

NEW BUSINESS- None

UPCOMING EVENTS- Bev Smith reported that Fourth & Faith will be busy with many activities.

Taco Thursday's will start back on February 16th.

Card Party for January 11th has 93 people signed up. A card party marathon is in the planning stages. The committee is looking into possible corn hole, ping pong and euchre tournaments. Fun for all!

ADJOURNMENT AND LORD'S PRAYER-

President Dan led the council in the Lord's Prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 8:43pm.

Inspired: Slaying Giants, Walking on Water and Loving the Bible Again




The Lenten (and pre-Lenten) season will mark the beginning of a study opportunity that is a part of the journey to consider the possibility of adopting a statement that claims we are open and affirming of all people. I have chosen to begin with this book rather than those which study specific “clobber” passages (scriptures which have been used to oppose same-sex relationships). The reason is that it provides a gateway into thoughtful and engaging discussion. The author writes, “*Inspired* is intended to be read, wrestled with, discussed, debated, and creatively engaged within the context of community. **And that's because the Bible invites us to do the same.**”

The Bible does not always provide clear, straightforward answers. Often, we are left to interpret story, song, and poetry to glean a truth for how we live. I especially like that the author doesn't encourage opposition but invites differences. Questions like, “is there a Bible story that has always struck you as troubling?” and “Have you found it to be true that sometimes you've had to “fake it ‘til you make it when it comes to trusting portions of the Bible?”

I found this book and its questions to be both fun and challenging. I believe you too will enjoy being inspired by this discussion. The book is definitely worth reading, but the discussion easily includes those who have not read the book or who fall behind in the schedule.
