



### St. John's UCC Church Council Meeting January 14, 2024 at 7:30 pm

**Opening Prayer** - Reverend Cassandra lit the Christ candle and opened the meeting with a prayer. There were 14 members and baby Sonia in attendance.

Minutes of the Last Meeting-Approved as submitted.

#### Treasurer's Report - Reported by Angie Gump

**Month of December 2024 -** General Fund Income for the month of \$56,275 is \$2,837 less than the budget. Expenses for the month of \$32,226 were under the budget by \$99. Resulting gain for the month of \$24,049 is \$2,738 less than the budget

**December 2024 YTD** - General Fund Income year-to-date of \$317,029 is \$4,071 less than the budget Compared to last year thru the same month income is lower by \$15,086 Expenses year-to-date of \$373,672 are less than budget by \$23,319. Resulting shortfall year-to-date of \$56,643 is \$19,248 better than the budget

**Cash** - Beginning cash balance for the year was \$75,644 and ending cash is \$25,146. We have transferred \$7,133 from investments to cover General Fund expenses. In addition to General Fund shortfall of \$56,643 we have disbursed \$54,028 from the Capital Improvement Fund for plaster repairs, parking lot repairs, HVAC in the office, lighting upgrades & replacement of the freezer in the Social Hall Kitchen. M/S/C by Rob Gump and Rudy Tschantz to approve the Treasurer's Report.

#### **Senior Minister's Report**

Reverend Cassandra reported the two Christmas Eve services were well attended and received. The services were on December 24<sup>th</sup> at 3pm and 7pm. The original play by Rev. Cassandra "No Room" was very special. The play offered a modern reading of Luke 2:1-7. Thank you to Natalie Peterman and the youth for providing props for the play.

Looking ahead to Ash Wednesday, "Ashes To-Go" at Fourth and Faith will be from 8am-10am. Ash Wednesday service will be at 7pm in the church sanctuary.

#### **Director of CE Report**

Natalie Peterman reviewed the Youth Group activities for the month and upcoming activities. The live nativity went well however, the second evening was cancelled due to inclement weather. The Parish Gift Bags are completed for the month. The "Homeless Awareness" event is in the planning stages. Several other church youth groups are being invited to participate. Natalie is evaluating the current Sunday School format and said there may be some changes that will help build multi-age relationships.

# Reports of the Boards Elders

Jean Paddock reported that February will be the Month of Compassion. February communion will be traditional passing of the elements. There are some security practices by the ushers now taking place during the church service. Current HR initiatives are for an associate pastor profile and creating an evaluation process for pastor and staff.

#### Trustees

Doug Peterman reported. Up to \$145,000 was approved by the congregation for new air conditioning in the sanctuary building. The Trustees have two bids for the project. They are planning to make a decision as soon as possible so that the new system will be in place before cooling season. The leak in the heating system in the back office has been repaired. There is a heating issue in the choir room. The custodial staff is doing a great job keeping the sidewalks cleaned from the snow. Rob Gump will check to make sure salt is being used on the parking lot.

#### Deacons

Jen Conkle reported the ushers and communion servers are secured for February.

#### Reports of Committees Nominating Committee

President Dave gave an update on nominees for Elders: Sue Ferbrache and Dan Hurst; Trustees: Rob Gump and Doug Peterman, Jr; Deacon: Bev Smith; Youth on Council: Nolan Peterman and Board of Christian Education: Carol McCutcheon, Laura Brown and Natasha Spinell. Candidates will be voted on at the Congregational Meeting after the church service on January 26<sup>th</sup>.

#### Finance Committee

Advent Offering collection was \$650 distributed equally between Friends of the Homeless and Tuscarawas Clinic for the Working Uninsured. Staff Love Gift collection was distributed in the amount of \$150 per staff member
