

# St. John's UCC Church Council Meeting October 14, 2025 at 7:30 pm

**Opening Prayer:** Dave Gingrich opened the meeting and Reverend Cassandra Granados gave the opening prayer. There were 15 members present.

Minutes of Last Meeting: Approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report: Reported by Holly Gonter

Month of September 2025

General fund income for the month of \$17,228 is \$6,380 worse than budget.

Expenses for the month of \$28,811 were under the budget by \$8.211.

Resulting shortfall for the month of \$11,583 is \$1,831 better than the budget.

September 2025 YTD

General fund income year-to-date of \$181,448 is \$37,324 less than the budget.

Compared to last year thru the same month (center column) income is lower by \$33,438.

Expenses year-to-date of \$282,977 were less than budget by \$26,303.

Note: Budget includes \$9,000 per month for an Associate Minister beginning with July

Resulting shortfall year-to-date of \$101,528 is \$11,020 worse than the budget.

### Cash

Beginning cash balance for the year was \$25,146 and ending cash is \$10,496.

We have transferred \$82,355 from investments to cover general fund expenses.


