St. John's UCC Church Council Meeting November 12, 2024 at 7:30 pm

President Dave Gingrich called the meeting to order at 7:37pm with 16 members and baby Sonya present. President Dave Gingrich welcomed Reverend Cassandra back from maternity leave. She offered an opening prayer and lit the Christ candle.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved as written.

Angie Gump delivered the Treasurer's Report. The General Fund for the month of \$28,626 is \$5,418 more than budget. Expenses for the month of \$30,941 were over the budget by \$312. The resulting shortfall for the month of \$2,315 is \$5,106 better than the budget. General Fund Income year to date of \$243,513 is \$4,733 better than budget. Expenses for the year-to-date of \$316,235 are lower than the budget by \$19,350 resulting in a year-to-date shortfall of \$72,722 which is \$24,083 better than the budget. Beginning cash balance for the year was \$75,644 and the ending cash is \$19,833. We've transferred \$19,416 from investments to cover General Fund expenses and disbursed \$16,703 from the Capital Improvement Fund for plaster repairs, lighting upgrades and replacement of the freezer in the Social Hall kitchen. M/S/C by Dan Dummermuth and Rob Gump.

Senior Minister's Report

Reverend Cassandra thanked everyone for showering their family with love and gifts on the birth of baby Sonya. She appreciated the church being flexible and accommodating during her maternity leave. She reviewed past events and updated Council on upcoming events.

Director of Christian Education Report

The Director of Christian Education, Natalie Peterman reported on the Youth Group. In November there will be a Friendsgiving and December the Advent Festival, Christmas Pageant and the Live Nativity. Trunk or Treat with three churches involved was fun and successful. Parish Visitor gifts bags for November are ready to go. She also reviewed future plans for Winter/Spring 2025.

Elders

Jon McIllivane and the Elders are continuing to formulate an Associate Pastor Job description. The Elders and President Dave are working on a Staff Evaluation Form. The Elders announced there be two Christmas Eve services this year. They will be held at 3pm and 7pm. There will be no communion offered at these services. The December Advent offering will be divided equally between the Homeless Shelter and the Clinic for the Working Uninsured. A December love gift offering will be collected in December for staff appreciation gifts.

<u>Trustees</u>

Dan Dummermuth updated Council that the church offices have new mini splits for cooling and heating. Reverend Cassandra reported her office is toasty on cold days. Council had approved \$20,000 and the cost came in at \$13,000. The funds came from the Capital Improvement Endowment Fund. Estimates are coming in for updating the air conditioning in the Sanctuary Building. M/S/C by Dan Dummermuth and Rob Gump to not exceed \$145,000 for air conditioning in the Sanctuary Building. The funds will be taken from the Capital Improvement Endowment Fund. This expenditure will be voted on by the congregation on Sunday, November 17th at the Congregation Meeting after church. The boiler has gone through inspection and the trees have been trimmed. Future projects will be air conditioning in the Education Building.

Deacons

The Deacons, as reported by Bev Smith, have secured ushers and communion servers for December. Past Scholarship recipients will be asked to usher at the Christmas Eve services.


